




Joy of Cranleigh

What was happening in Cranleigh in December 1916?



A rather menacing Christmas card



he food situation throughout the country was beginning to give cause for alarm. German Uboats were targeting food imports from North and South America with considerable success. An article in the Surrey Advertiser stressed the need for every farmer to make the most of the food-producing potential of his land, so that the country would not have to depend so much on foreign supplies. Wheat and oats were especially needed.

It was not easy for farmers to respond to this call, having lost so many of their labourers to the armed forces. But in the same issue of the Advertiser, the Army announced that at the Training Depot, Aldershot, there were over 80 former agricultural labourers, who were either temporarily unfit for service overseas or fit for home service only. These were available for farmers in the district to employ. Their pay would be 4s per day, if they found their own bed and breakfast, or 2s 6d, if the farmer provided these. Only men experienced in agriculture would be sent.

The Surrey Advertiser also carried this advertisement: 'Xmas presents for the Forces. Send your soldier friends a pudding made with 'ATORA' Shredded Beef Suet. Requires no chopping and makes the best puddings and mincemeat. British made and owned. Your Grocer sells it. 1s per 1 lb, and 6½ dper ½lb boxes'. This product had been invented in 1893 by a Frenchman living in Manchester, and promoted around the country by a wagon pulled by Hereford bullocks.

At Christmas, the wounded soldiers at Oaklands Military Hospital in Knowle Lane were showered with gifts from Cranleigh shops and residents. Turkeys, beef, plum puddings, mince pies, fruit cakes, sweets, nuts and crackers were delivered. George and Lady Bonham invited them to Knowle for 'tree and tea and Father Christmas' on 23 December. The wards were decorated by the soldiers, and on Christmas Day each man received a stocking. After a service held in the hospital, those men who were able went also to the parish church. A great lunch followed, at which the King's message was read, with all standing, and hearty toasts were drunk. The commandant, Mrs Rowcliffe, provided a bran tub full of presents. Entertainment, conjuring and a whist drive completed the day.





Meanwhile, on the Western Front, Rennie Crick, son of the owner of the Cranleigh shoe shop, celebrated Christmas in a more modest manner. He was serving with the Royal Army Medical Corps, and



was currently working in a hospital at the 11th Division's Rest Station at Léalvillers, west of Thiepval. The Army Service Corps served up 'a grand dinner of roast pork and plum pudding'. Rennie contrived to watch or play plenty of football, too, involving different teams all stationed near this Divisional Rest Station. On December 31st, for example, 'our Ambulance team played the 15th Squadron, Royal Flying Corps, and we won 3-2. It was a grand match.'

The December issue of The Cranleighan reported that Cranleigh School's Officers' Training Corps was now 230 strong, and had been concentrating on musketry, signalling and bayonet fighting. They had held 'operations' on Farley Heath and Blackheath. The Prep School, opened in 1913, now had

64 boys, and during the summer holiday a school chapel (a wooden hut) had been built quickly by Mr Frederick Warren. He 'had taken a great deal of pains to make everything as nice as possible', and had very kindly agreed to be paid by instalments.

This is not about making money, although of course I have to pay the bills! This is about happiness, fulfilment, following your heart and ambitions, and peace of mind. The Arts; Voice-over work, appeared to be a natural fit and something that I can hopefully get off the ground largely from my home studio and without too much initial cost.

I would of course love to take my passion for the stage from the amateur world of local am-dram to the professional stage, and if a break in that area comes as a bi-product of 'getting out there' so to speak in the VO world and Extras work that I am also doing then... great. However, it's the Voice-over work that I am focusing on.

I know for a fact that earning a living from Voice-over will most certainly not happen overnight and it will take a lot of hard work and dedication to get myself established. It's a huge step into the unknown, and a life change for me and my family, who are of course right behind me on this journey. I don't know where the path will ultimately lead, but I do know that whatever happens, it's the right choice and I am determined to make it work somehow.

It's a cliché I know, but possibly one of the truest out there....'Life is no dress rehearsal', so go for it, you are only on this planet once.

Crane Spotter: tales from a Cranleigh birder December-

Siberian visitor brings an early Christmas

ith winter approaching, many bird species have been escaping the bitter north and relocating in recent weeks. That's usual.

However the prolonged easterly and north easterly winds of late September and October 2016 were unprecedented in many birders' memories — and they left behind a spectacular feast of migrants that nobody could have predicted.

Chief among them was a species that figures alphabetically first on the index of birds for this part of the world, known as the Western Palearctic. But it was about the last thing any birder in Britain ever expected to turn up.

The nearest lookalike we could get was its near relative, the Dunnock, aka the Hedge Accentor, which is common throughout Surrey. But it was no substitute.

And then, just a few weeks back, something so monumental happened it will stay in birding folklore forever

An Accentor. More specifically – a Siberian Accentor. We'd all admired its picture in books and dreamed of seeing one since we were kids.

But with not even one ever having made it to Britain, and the nearest breeding population some 2,400 miles from Cranleigh in Arctic Russia, we knew it would stay a dream. There weren't even reckoned to be more than 1,000 pairs within our ecozone.

So the little streaky, rusty and brown bird, sporting a black cap and cheek-patch and a broad buffy stripe (supercilium) above its eye, was destined to stay the mythical creature it always had been. Far out of reach with a frozen wasteland between us.

iberian Accentor – on British soil, The Shetlands

My local birding mates Matt (@mostlyscarce) and Ed (@Godalming_birds) had asked me to join them on a trip to The Shetlands. But I declined, reasoning that a good bird could turn up on the mainland and I'd be trapped on the islands and unable to get to it. So what happens? Off they go and they are just about to take the boat from Aberdeen when mega news comes through. In a quarry, just down the road from where they are going to be staying, someone has found a 'first for Britain.' You guessed it. A Siberian Accentor!

Oh no! My heart missed a beat while theirs increased to epic proportions as they wished the night ferry could only go faster. They ensured word soon came through to me next day. The bird was still there - and they'd just got it! Seeing pictures of them holding their cameras showing photos of the bird really rubbed it in. Gotcha!

Of course, I was very happy for them but a bit gutted for myself. Next day the bird had gone. Oh well, you can't see everything. But then something even more crazy happened. Three days later news came through that a second bird had been found. This was unbelievable! And this time it was much nearer to home, on the east coast of Yorkshire, near Spurn. The trouble was that news only came out in the afternoon so we could not get there until dark. I didn't sleep well that night.

At first light the next day my friend Hugh and I heard it was still present. Yippee! So off we set, sweating most of the journey for fear it would fly off before we arrived. We need not have worried. By lunchtime we were watching it closely, feeding apparently ravenously alongside two slightly larger Dunnocks. Flation!

According to Collins Bird Guide the Siberian Accentor, which should have been wintering in completely the other direction - Korea and eastern China - is 'shy, keeps mostly to cover.' Well, not this one.

As it fed, pecking among the leaves and moss on an old school playground, it came within 10 feet of us and we didn't even need binoculars. What a moment. It nearly landed on one bloke's head. We'd never seen it before - and it had probably never seen humans before.

After that, the day got even better as we saw two rare Dusky Warblers among a fall of other scarce arrivals and 'Sibes' in the vicinity that had been brought in by the winds. They included Rose-coloured Starling, Pallas's Warbler, and Olive-backed Pipit. Someone counted over 500 Robins. The bushes were dripping with them.

For the next few days it became clear this Siberian Accentor's arrival was far from a one-off. More began appearing at various sites along the east coast and northern islands. As I write there have now been 12 in Britain and getting on for 300 in at least 10 other countries in a narrow band across northern Europe. The birding world has never seen anything like it.

Only time will tell if there is a repeat of this 'irruption', which is thought to have been partially fuelled with the help of an excellent breeding season due to exceptionally high insect numbers.

In time, who knows, Siberian Accentor could become a regular bird in Britain and might even make it onto the Cranleigh list.



ROMANIAN CHILDREN SHOEBOX APPEAL 2016

Many, many thanks for your generosity



he scale of response to our joint appeal for gift-filled shoeboxes has been truly marvellous, again highlighting the persistent generosity of schoolchildren and residents of Cranleigh and surrounding areas. This year we collected almost 1,100 boxes from ten local schools (listed below) plus around 300 boxes donated by, in particular, parishioners of St. Nicolas, as well as members of the public and personnel in some local businesses.

Each of the boxes will certainly enhance the quality of Christmas for so many of the deprived and disabled children in Hunedoara, western Romania. In addition, the process of selecting and packing the wide range of gift items will undoubtedly have created a strong feel-good factor among the children (and, of course, adults) who participated in this most charitable exercise. Indeed, that sense of pride was so clearly evident amongst those



children we met when collecting the boxes, regardless of whether the school's children contributed a 'handful' of boxes or, as in the case of two schools, more than 250 each! The Cranleigh-area gifts were supplemented by those from various centres in south-eastern counties, and

so the overall number of boxes (plus some suitcases full of household items and clothes) despatched from Cranleigh on 18th November was almost 1.800.

The boxes were picked up in Cranleigh by the key Romanian figure in this 'shoebox campaign', namely Pastor Corneliu Medrea who, together with his wife Diana, set up the Bethlehem Centre (www.betelccb.ro) in Hunedoara, western Romania in the 1990's. As well as conducting Christian activities, the centre also seeks to develop practical projects to meet the dire physical and material needs of those around them. They have used their received aid over the years to create not only a community social-care centre, but also to provide hygiene facilities for children in families with no running water or electricity, as well as a daily-meals programme for children with little or no food. They also operate after-school clubs to support the educational needs of illiterate children.

These donated shoeboxes will be distributed to children in the Hunedoara area just before Christmas and we plan to give all our gift-donating schools, and other donors, some Romanian feedback early in the New Year, hopefully with pictures of some recipient children.

Attached is a selection of photos taken at some of the participating schools, as well as photos that indicate the sorting-and-packing and truck-loading processes in readiness for the long journey to Romania.





Winter bites!

It's the time of year when the cold weather can dictate what we need to eat in order to keep us warm inside.

fter a long refreshing walk outside in the cold winter air, it's nice to come home to a roaring fire and a hot meal to warm you up. So, why not try this 3 course winter warmer.

LEEK & POTATO SOUP



Ingredients

600g floury potatoes peeled and diced approx 2cm cubes

1 med size leek washed and cut small

2 shallots peeled and sliced

2 large sticks of Celery chopped small

50g butter

20 mls oil

750 mls of good stock

Seasoning

Preparation

- In a suitable saucepan (I use non stick) heat the oil and when really hot add the butter and then the shallots and celery
- 2. Fry this until translucent then add the leek stirring well
- 3. When the leek becomes soft, add the potatoes and the stock
- **4.** Bring to the boil, reduce the heat and let simmer until the potatoes are very soft
- Add the seasoning and blend to a smooth consistency
- To avoid separation add some flour and butter mix, re-boil and after adjusting its density, rest on very low heat until required

P.S. The soup can be prepared in advance and reheated when required.



BAKED CORNER GAMMON

For this dish I usually ask a butcher to select the meat especially

Serves Four People

Ingredients

600g of corner Gammon either smoked or green 100g of soft brown sugar Some 30 cloves

Preparation

- 1. Soak the meat overnight
- 2. With fresh water, bring the meat to the boil and then simmer for 1 hour
- Take the pan away from the heat and let it cool for I hour
- 4. Take the meat out and place it onto an oven dish
- 5. Remove the skin from the meat leaving all the fat



- 6. Stick all the cloves regularly on the fat and then spread all the sugar
- 7. Bake the meat in a hot oven at 200° C for 20 minutes and then reduce the heat to 120° C for a further 20 minutes. Rest for a while and serve sliced

P.S. Try to slice the meat as thin as possible as it may be chewy

P.P.S. This dish can be prepared in advance and reheated in an oven at 120°C



POTATO GRATIN

Serves Four People

Ingredients

500g potatoes peeled and sliced thinly 200 mls of hot milk 60a butter 100g grated Cheddar Cheese Seasoning

Preparation

- 1. Place the potatoes orderly evenly in a buttered aratin dish
- 2. Season well and pour the milk over it making sure it is almost covered, plus the butter in small knobs
- 3. Sprinkle regularly the cheese over it
- 4. Bake in an hot oven at 180°C until the top is golden brown, then reduce to 120°C until the potatoes are cooked
- 5. Keep in warm place until required

N.B. This dish can also be prepared in advance and reheated when needed by adding a little milk on the top

> BRUSSELS SPROUTS can be served "al dente" and BUTTERED

BAKED APPLES & CUSTARD SAUCE

Serves Four People

Ingredients

4 medium size Bramley apples 69 g of a good quality micemeat 20a butter 100g soft cane sugar 300 mls of freshly made custard

Preparation

- 1. Cleanly core the washed apples without totally perforating them and cut their skin all around
- 2. Fill them with a little butter and top them with mincemeat
- 3. Place them in a buttered oven dish and cover each one with the sugar
- 4. Pour some water in the dish so as not to let the apples stick to it
- 5. Cook in a hot oven at 160°C for 40 minutes.
- 6. Keep warm until required and serve with hot custard sauce

N.B. Also this dish can be prepared in advance and reheated in an oven at 100°C







BOOK **REVIEW**

A Walk to Remember

by Nicholas Sparks

ure to wring yet more tears from willing readers' eyes, the latest novel by



the bestselling Sparks is a forced coming-of-age story concerning a pair of unlikely young lovers. In a corny flashback device that mimics The Notebook, 57-year-old Landon Carter spirits himself back to his fateful senior year in high school in Beaufort, N.C., when he was an archetypal troublemaking teenager of the 1950s, changed forever by an unexpected first love. Jamie Sullivan, the Bible-toting minister's daughter, with her drab brown sweaters, spinster hairstyle and sincere, beatific advice, is the obvious target of high school ridicule.

Despite conspiring in Jamie's derision, class president Landon, desperate for a date for the homecoming dance, finds himself asking Jamie. Afterwards, Jamie asks him to participate with her in the metaphor-laden school Christmas play (Jamie plays the angel). Landon endures the taunting of his friends and forms an uneasy friendship with Jamie, which is carefully supervised by her father.

The teens visit needy orphans, give Oscar-worthy performances in the school play and share dreams watching the sunset. Landon realizes he's in love with Jamie, but, of course, she is hiding a devastating secret that could wring her from Landon's arms forever. Now tortured by his knowledge of what will be her terrible fate, he must make the ultimate decision that catapults him into adulthood.

Readers may be frustrated with the invariable formula that Sparks seems to regurgitate with regularity. Although the narrator declares, "My story can't be summed up in two or three sentences; it can't be packaged into something neat and simple that people would immediately understand," this is the author's most simple, formulaic, and blatantly melodramatic package to date.
