

Joy of Cranleigh

What was happening in Cranleigh in September 1917?



Patients and staff at the Red Cross Auxiliary Hospital at Oaklands

The group picture shows the patients and staff at the Red Cross Auxiliary Hospital at Oaklands, Knowle Lane, a house which Sir George Bonham of Knowle had made available rent free. The men were all convalescent war-wounded soldiers from a wide variety of regiments. They are wearing uniform of navy blue with a red tie, and they had become a familiar sight in Cranleigh. The village took the soldiers to its heart and treated them as heroes, raising money, knitting and sewing, and laying on entertainments.

A scrapbook still exists that was made by the quartermaster, Hester Godfrey. Pictures from it are reproduced by permission of Surrey History Centre, Woking (SHC, 6250/1, Oaklands Red Cross Hospital Scrapbook, 1916-18).

Hester lived at West Gables on the Common, and was given this printed scrapbook as a Christmas present. She entered photos and newspaper cuttings, autographs, programmes and drawings, and created a delightful souvenir. The camaraderie and fun among the soldiers and staff are very evident. Men were relieved to be safe and on the road to recovery, even if some of them must have wondered whether they would be employable in the future. A drawing by one R. Brown of the Royal Army Medical Corps says 'Come to Oaklands to recuperate'.

The scrapbook has printed double spreads going through the alphabet on topics like 'Grouses', 'Matron', 'Nurses' and 'Woodbines', with some background illustrations, but plenty of space for photos and mementoes to be added. Sadly, many of the


photos have deteriorated with time. The page headed 'Dispenser' has the autograph of Mr R. Hillman Attwell, the local chemist (the Cranleigh Pharmacy is on the site today). Pictures of Scots are on the spread entitled 'Jocks'. 'Rest' shows soldiers playing croquet. The garden they are playing in was originally designed by the great Gertrude Jekyll: all signs of her handiwork had vanished by this time.

The spread entitled 'Food' includes a photo of the cook, Mrs Clara Buckman, who came in daily from her home in the High Street. She must have had plenty of work as she catered for 33 men and 10 staff. Nevertheless, she stuck at it for two years, with an annual salary of £24, which rose to £26. Her husband, Albert, joined her in 1918, as gardener and general useful odd-job man, also looking after the pigs and poultry. He earned 28 shillings per week for this. 'Visitors' include J.H. Naumann, lieutenant, The Rifle Brigade, a near neighbour at Redhurst in Knowle Lane, whose father drowned when the Lusitania was sunk by German U-boats.

Batchelor, the charwoman and scrubber. Some of the dozens of soldiers who sign add poignant personal details, such as 'Gunner H.J. Denney, 27th Siege Battery, Royal Garrison Artillery, wounded at Ypres, 4 Sept. 1917'. R.A. Clemitson of the Durham Light Infantry gives two dates, in May and November 1917, perhaps indicating that he stayed at Oaklands for six months.



Stacey, Tina's eldest daughter

Life Changing Events

Tina Montague Care Worker

was born in Harrow, Middlesex, where I lived with my husband and 3 children, 2 girls and a boy. After I separated from my husband I moved to Horsham initially, for a new start. I then lived in Billingshurst for 10 years where I had twin girls. While living there I started my care business. At that time a lot of the clients were in Cranleigh which is where I met Phil, my present partner who is Cranleigh born and bred.

In my business I was a registered care provider in the area, predominantly providing private care for clients that were prepared to pay for it themselves. I had a small team and offered a lovely 1-to-1 service. My eldest daughter Stacey worked alongside me virtually from day one.

Stacey had previously done some training in a care home. I had a 10 year previous history of working in care myself and so I started the business. She came and worked with me and it just grew to a team of about 10 but still maintained our aim of '1 on 1' care. One of the local doctor's surgery always referred patients to us. I was definitely their first care provider. I then became a trainer in palliative care so I could train my staff

in palliative care and we started providing care to NHS patients for palliative, end of life care.

Stacey and I worked well together in the business. She had a caring nature. She was very calm and level-headed. I'm more highly strung. She was quiet though always smiley and very reliable, punctual and everyone liked her. She knew how to keep her work at work and home at home. She was good at what she did whereas I struggle with shutting off. I can be a workaholic.

Then one day everything changed. Stacey had just had a baby and was breast feeding. At first she found a lump under her arm. Because of the breast feeding we just thought it was mastitis. Then 2 days later she noticed another lump on the top of her head so I took her to the GP. The doctor thought it was mastitis too and didn't make a fuss, said there was no real rush to investigate. But he did get the lump under her arm checked and it turned out to be a melanoma, skin cancer. They were going to give her surgery to take all the nodes away but after a CT scan they realized the cancer was stage 4 which meant it was terminal and she had 6 months to live.

Stacey was just 28 years old. She was a mother to a 2 year old child and a 12 week old baby.

Throughout her illness she was very positive. She decided to become a vegan and started a chemo trial which we knew would never cure it but we thought it might give her more time. It must have been horrible for her. It was horrible for both of us. All the things we'd been doing for our clients at work were happening to her.

I found it difficult to cope. Thankfully I was helped massively, by a very good friend of mine – Dean who was my next door neighbour at the time. He was there for me 24/7. He had some understanding because he was an amputee himself, he was an amazing friend. I spent a lot of my time crying with him, but every time I went to see Stacey I put on a brave face, trying to be practical and encouraging.

Unfortunately I had to wind down the business. I stopped working so many hours and didn't take on any more new clients. I rented a bigger house so we could all spend Christmas together – there were 15 of us for Christmas dinner that year - 2015. We had a big family Christmas and we were all being positive.

Unfortunately, the cancer had spread rapidly and her condition deteriorated. The consultant took me aside telling me she had just weeks to live. Stacey

was a beautiful stunning girl. She wanted to get married so we needed to get on and do it. I then had to be positive and say 'Let's plan your wedding darling!'

I got going and managed to organize a big white wedding within 10 days. I had a lot of help from the community, mostly Horsham based people because she lived in Partridge Green. People donated all manner of things. I created a Just Giving page. Loads of people helped. We had cars and flowers donated. I bought her dress and the bridesmaids dresses. The Just Giving page raised £8000 so that paid for her wedding and subsequently her funeral.

She was married 4 weeks before she died. I was emotionally and financially completely broken, totally. Although all Stacey's care was free I hadn't been able to focus on work though I tried to keep the business running. I gave all my clients to other care companies to be with her as much as I could.

I spent every day and every other night with her. It was very draining even though the hospice did all her care. The driving to and fro took its toll though you don't think about it at the time. It was incredibly hard and I wasn't coping well either. I felt terribly lonely and finances were an added burden. I had gone from having silly amounts of money to nothing.

I took another 9 months off work. I didn't work at all at that time. I just muddled through with the support of my partner Phil. We lost the house straightaway. It was only rented but it had to go. I was lucky I had a caravan down on Hayling Island so I went to stay there which was a lot cheaper than renting a house.

We stayed there for months and then once I was strong enough to come back to work I took on a couple of clients back up here so we were commuting. It wasn't too bad coming up the A3 from Hayling Island. It sounds a long way but we would drive

up very early and return very late. The journey took about 45 minutes. Hayling Island is a lovely place to live but we realized it just wasn't practical for us by then.

Through Facebook I took on a couple of clients and started rebuilding the business. Obviously I had a good reputation. I am now at a stage where I have 4 clients, working just by myself. I don't specialize in personal care or palliative care anymore. I just look after people, keep them running on a daily basis, for up to 3 hours a day for each client. I provide meals for all my clients now which are home cooked, hot meals. I've also just started pet therapy. So I'm doing care but in a slightly more alternative way so it doesn't take up my whole life. I have a bit more free time to share with my family and I'm doing something I enjoy more rather than going back fully into the whole caring, hands-on, end of life work. It's a gentle way back in to earning some money. I've always been a workaholic so I need to work just to keep myself functioning. Things are going well and hopefully after Christmas I plan to re-register the company and take on some staff again.


Before then though I am off to Australia for 2½ months. I made a friend over there who's son died at the same age as Stacey. We met through a grieving mother's site so I'm going to spend a couple of months with her as part of the healing process.

As well as losing Stacey there was a big family breakdown after her death. I was a palliative trainer myself but I didn't realise when she was dying what else was going on around me. I now see that much clearer. When people die it can bring the best out in someone - or the worst.

Looking to the future my long-term vision is to have an amazing care company, totally different to anyone else where it is far more personal, not too large. I won't have any of this dashing in for half an hour, flicking a flannel round people's faces and leaving. I don't agree with 'mass produced care' at all. I was hoping to hand the business down to Stacey which would have been a natural progression, and then to retire. Her other sister Charis is 20 now. She is at University doing a psychology degree. My son Piers is 19 and the twins are only 10. I was hoping it would be a family business. I was hoping Charis would join the business at some stage in the future

but she's not showing any interest yet. Piers is just Piers! The twins are quite caring so maybe I will hand it down to them.

A year before Stacey died I was offered a lot of money for my company but I don't regret not accepting their offer. Everyone encouraged me to keep it – 'Don't sell it, it's your baby, you love what you do' my friends said. You never know what's round the corner do you?

After someone dies people say it affects you spiritually but I'm an atheist. I'm sure there's something out there. I do have a lot of signs from Stacey which pull me through especially at low points. But I don't believe in God or heaven, I've not gone that way. Maybe that's to come but at the moment it's quite raw and as I said I'm having a lot of help coming to terms with it. I had Stacey when I was 19 years old. It was 10 years before I had any other children. There's a big gap. It's just horrible but I do believe I'm here for a reason. I can't just give up. I have to fulfil that purpose. I think I'm pretty good at what I do and I will strive to do things better, in a more individual and varied way.

Crane Spotter: tales from a Cranleigh birder

September

Stirring things up: The Hobby



frequently than usual this month.

That's because as some of our summer visitors begin to leave us there are other birds starting to arrive for the autumn and winter.

And there is always the chance of an unexpected scarcity putting in an appearance too as it drifts over us on its migration to Africa or elsewhere in Europe.

Circling above Cranleigh and the surrounding villages right now there are restless loose flocks of scores of House Martins and Swallows, vacuuming the air of insects as they feed up for their long journeys ahead.

Some among them are still catching food for their chicks in the nest. These will be their third broods of the season. Joining in to help out mum and dad are their brothers and sisters from first and second broods. It's busy up there.

But crowds attract danger and something else is buzzing about with them. And I don't mean wasps. All this activity has alerted a predator who fancies its chances of diving into the swirling mass of birds and coming out of the lucky dip with a meal.

Suddenly there's pandemonium in the skies as alarm calls ring out. A dark, scythe shaped bird has been moving in stealthily. It makes a mad dash into the flock, scattering them in all directions. That aerial master, the Hobby, is on patrol.

This small streamlined falcon, resembling a giant Swift, is slightly smaller than the more familiar Kestrel. It is only a scarce visitor to the Cranleigh

area and can be seen occasionally from May when it arrives from South Africa.

It breeds relatively late – often in the nest a Carrion Crow was using earlier the same year – and so is more easily seen in the late summer when hunting to feed its family.

The Hobby can be hard to find as it flies fast and is often a distant speck to any observer on the ground. It also prefers to hunt early in the mornings and the evenings when fewer people are around.

Most of the views you get around here last just a few seconds before the bird, resembling a midget Peregrine, powers overhead and soon becomes a distant blur. I don't think I've ever seen one locally that sat in a tree to make viewing easy.

If you do get to observe a stationary one then look out for its slate blue upperparts, white throat, streaked underparts, moustache and what birders call its 'red trousers' that extend to under the tail.

A good place to see one in Surrey is from the board walk at Thursley National Nature Reserve. The bog there is home to a dazzling larder of dragonflies and damselflies – and these are a magnet to any passing hungry Hobby hunting for a quick snack on the wing.

In my opinion the ensuing aerial combats - involving stoops, looping the loops, and gliding - rival the very best on offer at last month's Wings and Wheels airshow at Dunsfold.



Hobby (Falco subbuteo)

The spectacular Hobby literally causes a stir whenever it is seen, by humans or prey, and appears to be aptly titled. Apparently the name comes from an old French verb 'hober' which means 'to stir'. Its Latin name, Falco subbuteo, also has an interesting twist. The table football game Subbuteo is named after it.

The game's inventor, Peter Andolph, was a keen birdwatcher and had wanted to call the game 'Hobby' but this trademark was refused. So he opted for part of the Latin name instead.



Changing Gardens

eptember, usually a cooler time of the year, can also be the time when your garden begins to transform as we go into the Autumn season.

Appetite for a change in diet with a three course Mediterranean meal

that delivers on flavour but won't break the bank.



Ingredients

- 2 Medium sized aubergines 200a Minced pork
- 2 small sweet peppers 1 green and 1 yellow finely sliced
- 1 tin of chopped tomatoes in tomato sauce (Napolina is the best)
- 2 sticks of celery chopped small
- 1 medium red onion chopped small
- 1 courgette sliced small
- 4 cloves of garlic, peeled, crushed and chopped 200g of Sardinian ewe cheese grated (ideally, but strong Cheddar is just as good) 40g of lard and 20 of olive oil
- Salt and pepper mill

Preparation

 Slice the Aubergines length-wise and take out the centre part keeping it for the stuffing. Now you have 4 boat like items ready to be filled Place them in a cool place after sprinkling them with some salt and pepper

- 2. In a non-stick large saucepan melt the lard and when very hot place in it all the sliced and chopped vegetable, including the centre part of the aubergines duly chopped. Cook on high heat for 15 minutes, stirring all the while
- Reduce the heat and simmer for a further half an hour stirring from time to time so it does not stick to the bottom. Season the and rest mixture.
- 4. During this time, in another saucepan heat the olive oil and fry in it the pork for 15-20 minutes stirring all the time. Avoid the meat sticking to itself by pressing it with a fork
- When cooked add the meat to the vegetable mixture, combine the two fully and fill the aubergines
- 6. Cover with the grated cheese. Rest them for 30 minutes
- 7. Place in the oven at 180°C for 20 minutes and at 140°C for a further 15 minutes
- Dress on an adequate serving dish and serve with it a mixed leaves salad and plenty of crusty bread

2 CAPRESE SALAD (INSALATA TRICOLORE)

Ingredients

300g mozzarella
2 large beefsteak tomatoes
2 ripe avocado pears
100g green and black olives
4 bouquets of Basil
60mls salad dressing (personal choice)

- Slice the tomatoes and the same with the mozzarella and the avocados
- 2. Arrange all on a large serving dish with the mozzarella in the middle
- 3. Place the olives all around the dish with the bouquets of Basil in the corners

3 RICE AND ALMOND TART (TORTA DI RISO E MANDORLE)

Ingredients

40g pudding rice
30g flaked almonds
50 mls Amaretto di Saronno liquor
240mls of milk
50mls double cream whisked thick
100g soft brown sugar
25g granulated sugar
Few drops of almond essence
The grated zest of an orange
A pinch of salt
300g short crust pastry

Preparation

- Boil the milk with the sugar and the almond essence
- 2. Add the rice, the pinch of salt and simmer until cooked and thick. Then mix into it the almonds, the orange zest and stand it to cool down
- Add the cream and the liquor, mix so it is all well amalgamated
- 4. Roll out the pastry and line a greased 150mm (6inch) baking tin with it
- Place the mixture in it. Spread the granulated sugar regularly over and bake in a hot oven at 180°C for 25 minutes
- 6. Serve cold with extra cream if required






